**JOB GOAL:** Responsible for scheduling bus routes and drivers in an assigned area.

**ESSENTIAL DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:**

*The following statements of duties and responsibilities are intended to describe the general nature and level of work being performed by individuals assigned to this position. These statements are not intended to be an exhaustive list of all duties and responsibilities required of all personnel within this position.*

1. Utilize established systems to schedule routes and drivers in an assigned area.
2. Assign relief bus drivers and substitute assistants to cover routes as needed.
3. Monitor radio communications that require action which include: relaying information concerning student disruptions, school bus breakdowns, medical emergencies, and accidents, which may or may not require law enforcement assistance.
4. Disseminate schedules, driver assignments, and changes to appropriate stakeholders.
5. Distribute bus routes, stops, pick-up and delivery times to drivers in an assigned area.
6. Prepare and maintain communication logs, records, and reports.
7. Report variances in bus schedules to designated staff and work with the Area Manager and Transportation Field Specialist to evaluate the placement of bus routes and stops.
8. Report any dangerous situations to appropriate transportation services.
9. Respond to emergency requests in a calm and intelligent manner while contacting the proper authorities, and initiate emergency procedures.
10. Provide guidance and direction to school bus drivers on operating policies and procedures.
11. Schedule and administer dexterity tests.
12. Ability to understand potential problems and opportunities while identifying appropriate solutions.
13. Assign spare buses as needed.
14. Assume school bus driver or transportation assistant responsibilities as required to maintain the daily operation of transportation services.
15. Perform other duties as assigned.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:**

To perform this job successfully, the incumbent will possess the abilities or aptitudes to perform each duty successfully. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable qualified individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.*

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES:**

- General geographical knowledge of the county
- Operating knowledge of computer programs and ability to effectively use technology in daily work, including email, word processing, spreadsheets, and databases
- General office skills, such as typing, data entry, etc.
- Ability to communicate effectively with a variety of audiences, orally and in writing, including electronic media
- Ability to organize, prioritize, manage and carry out duties efficiently and within established timeframes
- Ability to establish and maintain collaborative working relationships with all stakeholders

### SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITY:

Direct supervision of bus drivers, transportation assistants and other assigned personnel. Responsibilities include planning, assigning, and directing work; addressing complaints and resolving problems; training employees; evaluating performance; and interviewing, testing, hiring, and assignment of personnel

### PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS *(Describes physical conditions of this position):*

<input type="checkbox"/>	Sedentary Work	Exerting up to 10 pounds of force occasionally and/or a negligible amount of force frequently to lift, carry, push, pull or move objects. Sedentary work involves sitting most of the time. Jobs are sedentary if walking and standing are required only occasionally and all other sedentary criteria are met.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Light Work	Exerting up to 20 pounds of force occasionally and/or up to 10 pounds of force frequently. If the use of arm and / or leg controls require exertion of forces greater than that for sedentary work and the worker sits most of the time, the job is rated as Light Work.

R	Sitting	Resting with the body supported by the buttocks or thighs.

S	Crawling	Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet
S	Twisting	Moving body from the waist using a turning motion.
O	Reaching	Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction
O	Pushing	Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward or outward.
O	Pulling	Using upper extremities to drag, haul or tug objects in a sustained motion.
O	Lifting	Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position- to-position through the use of the upper extremities and back muscles.

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F	Finger Dexterity	Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand or arm.
O	Grasping	Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.
O	Feeling	Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips
R	Repetitive Motions	Substantial and continuous movements of the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.
R	Talking	Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Those activities in which detailed or important spoken instructions must be conveyed accurately, loudly or quickly.
R	Hearing Acuity	The ability of perceive speech and other environmental sounds at normal loudness levels.
R	Visual Acuity	The power to see at a level which allows reading of numbers and text, operations of equipment inspection of machines, etc.
