



School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

During the 2009-2010 school year, teachers and administrators continued to implement scientifically research based teaching practices through the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. A 90-minute uninterrupted reading block was coupled with a 30-minute intervention block that was instrumental in presenting the five components of reading for all students. The content areas of science and social studies were integrated with literacy skills during the 90-minute reading block. In writing, students completed a quarterly demand writing assessment and we began Author's Teas that spotlighted great writers in each classroom. Teachers worked through the textbook adoption process and assisted the district in adopting a new math series. Our lower achieving students in reading and math received remediation through a variety of resources based on their individual needs.
