

School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

Based on the continuous school improvement process at Charles S. Rushe Middle School, students continued to show significant growth in reading.

The Lead Literacy Team and the Student Success Team were the driving force behind student achievement. The implementation of "One Book, One Community," set the tone for our students and teachers with a focus on literacy in each subject area. Each student at Rushe received an "Article of the Week," which reinforced the importance of reading informational text and comprehension.
