

School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

Our School Improvement Plan focused on Student Achievement and providing a Safe School Environment. Although we addressed all academic areas, our school wide emphasis was in the areas of reading and math. By participating in the Response to Intervention pilot program, our teachers met as teams several times throughout the year and used data to both identify students with needs and make plans to address those needs. Our staff was involved in a variety of professional development opportunities to give them tools to address the areas of literacy workstations, math workstations, small group instruction, and writing across the curriculum. We continued to utilized the 1,2,3 Magic discipline program and implemented weekly social skill lessons. With this we were able to decrease our Office Discipline Reports tremendously.
