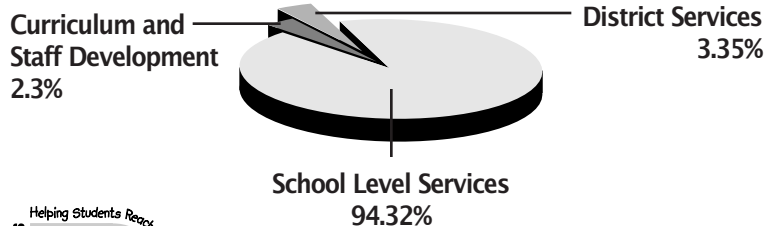

## School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

Pine View Elementary School focused on the goal areas of student performance in Reading and Mathematics. We focused professional development for teachers on the continued implementation of best practices in reading and the adopted reading series. This allowed all students to receive high quality reading instruction daily that met their individual learning needs. Additionally, we provided intensive reading interventions for students not meeting proficiency levels. As a result, 87 percent of our third through fifth graders were proficient in reading as measured by the FCAT. In the area of mathematics, we developed professional learning communities for all teachers focused on the study of best practices. Teachers implemented guided math and math learning stations to meet differentiated student learning levels. As a result, 79 percent of our third through fifth graders were proficient in mathematics as measured by the FCAT. We will continue to focus on interventions and enrichment activities to improve all students' performance during the 2010-2011 school year.
