

School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

The focus of Pine View Middle School's Improvement Plan for the 2009-2010 year was to improve the academic achievement with a focus on Comparison and Cause/Effect. To strengthen instruction, research-based, high impact teaching strategies were presented to staff members during monthly lunch & learn sessions. Various new technology venues were also presented such as Moodle, Google.docs and iTunes U, from representatives from Instructional Services and Apple to strengthen curriculum development and extensions to promote higher order thinking. Study Island Progress Monitoring continued to be implemented for all academic areas. To encourage family involvement, a variety of Family Academies were held during the year, which included: Science Family Academy, Language Arts Family Academy: Holiday Traditions, Night Under the Stars, Spring Concert, Student Art Exhibition and the Alumni Career Showcase (CCTE).
