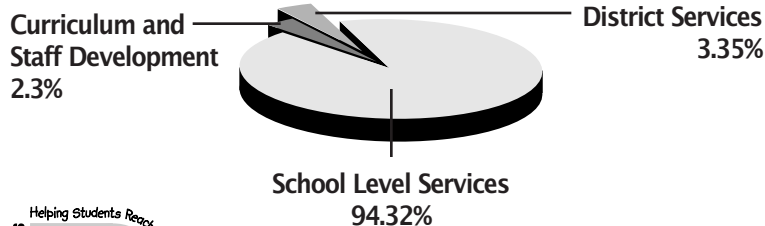

Message from the Principal

Trinity Elementary had a successful 2009-10 school year. Our third grade had outstanding performance in both reading and math with 85 percent demonstrating proficiency in reading and 90 percent in math. We earned the grade of "B" under the Florida School Recognition Program, and made Adequate Yearly Progress under the Federal No Child Left Behind Act. We submitted nine entries in the Jim Harbin Media Festival and garnered nine first places in the District Competition. We are awaiting results from the region and state competitions. Trinity's community service was highlighted several times in the press for our Walking School Bus and community recycling which were added to our existing projects.

School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

Utilizing transdisciplinary teaching strategies which included content in reading instruction resulted in 85 percent of the students reading at or above grade level, and 53 percent of struggling students making a year's worth of progress in reading. Writing instruction included writing across the curriculum, which resulted in 85 percent of student meeting state standards in writing. New teachers were trained in guided reading, writer's workshop and assessment techniques, skills that are critical in determining the academic needs of students. Teachers work together on teams to assure the needs of each student are met.
