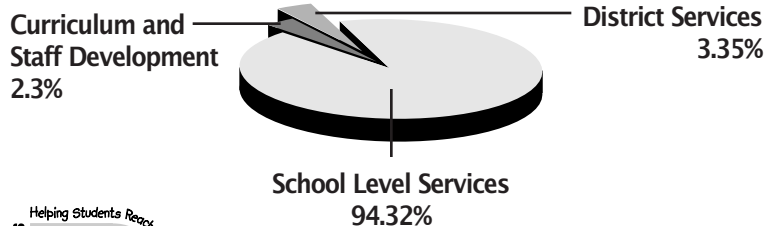

School Improvement Plan 2010-2011

The assessment data collected from the 2009-2010 school year shows that many students at Trinity Oaks Elementary School made learning gains in all academic areas. Our students scored at or above the district averages in reading, writing, math and science. We are especially proud of our students' improvement in science. Over the past year, we developed an RtI (Response to Intervention) Leadership Team. This team meets monthly to monitor school wide data in order to identify student achievement trends. We reflect on our student data to plan for instruction so that the individual needs of students are met. Professional development for teachers is based around students' needs. The Lead Literacy Team (LLT) at Trinity Oaks meets twice a month to discuss school-wide improvement goals and review data from classroom-based assessments. They develop and conduct classroom walkthroughs based on best practices to determine areas of improvement for professional development and coaching. Our goal is to increase student performance by empowering our staff and students!
