Design Question 7 – Recognizing Adherence and Lack of Adherence to Classroom Rules and Procedures

Desired Effect: Students follow the rules and procedures.

Design Question 7 includes 3 elements:

Element 33 – Demonstrating “Withitness” (an awareness of what is happening in all parts of the classroom at all times)

Element 34 - Applying Consequences for Lack of Adherence to Rules and Procedures

Element 35 - Acknowledging Adherence to Rules and Procedures



What will I do to recognize and acknowledge adherence to classroom rules and procedures?

Consequences are a result or effect of actions.

Consequences should be both positive and negative.

- Teacher reinforces **adherence** to rules and procedures as opposed to taking it for granted – willingness to be a positive influence.
- Teacher acknowledges **lack of adherence** to rules and procedures - behavior that detracts from learning.

Consequences should be established at the beginning of the year.

Consequences are typically addressed routinely and frequently.
