NEOLA Updates (June 2019)

Kevin Shibley (Assistant Superintendent for Administration) reviewed policies in the NEOLA Update (June 2019) before the policies are submitted for Board approval. Policy 6330 was pulled and discussion was held on several of the policies.

School Day Schedule

Superintendent Browning proposed a salary plan to the board with the goal of identifying approximately \$43 million for employee salaries over the course of the next two years. Funding would come from primarily 2 sources: prioritizing new state funds and re-visiting the schedules of the district's secondary classroom teachers with the objective of increasing student contact time from 5 to 6 periods at the middle and high school levels, starting in the 2020/2021 school year. USEP has been a part of the conversation; more details would need to be worked out and the proposal is subject to collective bargaining. Staff met with principals yesterday; still need to meet with teachers, etc. Board members shared comments and concerns and were requested to forward questions to Kevin Shibley.

Other Discussion

Member Armstrong distributed the FSBA Legislative Platform Report and asked board members to forward items for this year's legislative platform to her. She gave kudos to Wayne Bertsch for his work in Tallahassee.

Superintendent Browning reported that elementary and secondary workgroups are reviewing student testing for streamlining purposes; information will be shared at a later date.
